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Donor shortage is the key issue in liver transplantation. Strategies to overcome donor shortage are to increase the use of older donors, split grafts and living donors as well as the donors after cardiac death. Purpose of review Over the past decades, visceral transplantation has become the standard of care for patients with irreversible intestinal failure who suffer complications of total parenteral nutrition (TPN). Graft-versus-host disease (GVHD) after solid organ transplantation is a rare but often fatal complication with high mortality.

Liver/intestine or full multivisceral transplantation is needed because of difficulty securing inflow (portal vein flow) to the liver. Postoperative management of this group is similar to management of liver transplant patients, although the intestine needs special care.
