Neurodevelopmental disorders are a group of disorders that are typically diagnosed during childhood and are characterized by developmental deficits in personal, social, academic, and intellectual realms; these disorders include attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and autism spectrum disorder. ADHD is characterized by a pervasive pattern of inattention and/or hyperactive and impulsive behavior that interferes with normal functioning.

Also, the American Psychological Association's division 12 (Clinical Psychology) has two sects devoted to children. A newer field of expertise, Developmental Psychopathology has come about focused on studying childhood disorders from a more developmental perspective (Nietzel et al. 1998).

Healthcare professionals use the guidelines in The American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual, Fifth edition (DSM-5) 1 , to help diagnose mental health disorders in children.
